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**COMMUNITY FOUNDATION GIVES \$100,000 TO LOCAL NONPROFITS FOR THIRD YEAR**  
***The Park City Foundation's Ski & Golf Pass Supports Local Charities***

**PARK CITY, UTAH – December 21, 2010** – The Park City Foundation has announced \$100,000 in grants to local nonprofit organizations through the Community Fund, an annual, competitive grant program. The Community Pass program, a ski and golf pass, provides the majority of the grant funds. The grants are made in support of Health & Human Services, Education, Arts & Culture, After-School Programs, Conservation & Environment and Animals. The Park City Foundation is a community foundation serving Summit County, Utah.

The grant program is in its third year and serves Summit County's nonprofit organizations. This year, fifty-seven organizations requested just over \$400,000; through a diligent, two-stage process, twenty-one organizations will receive a total of \$100,000. "There are always more requests from quality organizations than we have funding to give," says Emily Scott Pottruck, Grants Committee Chair and Board Vice Chair. "However, we work hard to fund organizations that are well governed, programs that are well-designed, and needs that are deserving. We also keep our community foremost - we strive to support organizations that create a vibrant and unique Park City." Throughout the year, board members and staff of The Park City Foundation conduct site visits to evaluate each organization and their programs.

The Park City Foundation, not yet four years old, is among over 700 community foundations across the nation. This past year PCF was recognized by CFInsights, a national organization that evaluates foundations, ([www.cfinsights.org](http://www.cfinsights.org)) for their grant making programs. PCF was ranked 7th in Most Active Grantmakers and 80th in most gifts per capita in a report about the community foundation field ([www.cfinsights.org/Knowledge/ViewArticle/ArticleId/5/Benchmarking-Beyond-Asset-Size-New-Top-100-Lists.aspx](http://www.cfinsights.org/Knowledge/ViewArticle/ArticleId/5/Benchmarking-Beyond-Asset-Size-New-Top-100-Lists.aspx)). "Our organization launched as the economy plummeted," explains Trisha Worthington, Executive Director. "We want to ensure we're supporting community needs right now while also looking towards long-term, sustainable funding. It is a challenging balance, but we're thankful to the donors who have made it possible."

The Community Pass is critical to their success. It includes fully transferrable skiing at Park City Mountain Resort and Canyons Resort. It also includes foursomes at public and private golf courses: Glenwild Golf Club & Spa, Jeremy Golf and Country Club, Park City Golf Club, Park Meadows Country Club, Promontory, Red Ledges Club, and Talisker Golf at Tuhaye. The resorts and clubs have donated their services and a handful of the twenty passes are still available. Passes are available for a partially deductible \$8,000 contribution; all proceeds benefit greater Park City's nonprofits.
